ARTA 3403 Advanced Typography

Course developed to expand expertise in designing with type. Typography projects will push creative boundaries of expression and experiment with diverse media. An emphasis on structural, technical, and communicative properties in contemporary design practice.

ARTA 3402 Intermediate Graphic Design

Studio course devoted to the design and implementation of multi-dimensional concepts and solutions. Course introduces UX/UI principles using humanity-centered research methods to establish an objective-driven design process.

ARTA 3401 Typography

Studio course exploring type form and content relationships. Projects emphasize type design, page layout, and font manipulation to bring visual resonance to a written message.

ARTA 2401 Graphic Design Theory

Introductory course focusing on visual communication theory and concept development.

The purpose of this course is to reinforce visual literacy, communication theory, research skills, and problem solving.

ARTA 2202 Layout and Production

Introductory course focusing on fundamental theories related to layout, technical aspects of analog and digital reproduction or publication. This course uses project-based learning to engage a design process for crafting functional and objective visual communication.

ART 4530 Art Internship

Tutored internship with local arts or design institutions that introduce students to working as an apprentice within a defined studio practice. Students gain pre-professional experiences and skills that increase awareness and practices within their field of study.

ART 4170 Graphic Design Studio

An advanced, capstone course where students work individually and in teams to design thesis research projects, create professional portfolios, present work to the public and complete client projects for on and off-campus organizations.

ART 3130 Graphic Design I

Students in this course focus on the essential elements of Graphic Design as a discipline and practice. Students learn tools, terminology and theory related to Graphic Design as a professional and artistic practice.
